THE DREAMS OF THE UROBOROS



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Lacatena Fine Arts is pleased to announce *The dreams of the Uroboros*, an exhibition dedicated to Neapolitan sculptor Rosa Panaro (Casal di Principe 1935 – Naples 2022)

The exhibition designed by architect Silvia Lacatena unfolds across two rooms, focusing on a precious group of nine sculptures in terracotta, polychrome ceramics, concrete and papier-mâché, produced by Panaro between 1973 and 1984, flanked by a selection of fourteen drawings on polystyrene trays belonging to a late, graphic corpus from 2019 - 2022.

The latter is a body of work that narrates the prolific dreamlike dimension of the artist, diligently captured in an intimate, hallucinatory diary at times characterized by wicked and terminal tones. The drawings, in their definitive form, are the result of a collaboration that Panaro undertakes in the last years of her life with artist Nicolas Xedro (*1982, Richmond, VA), to whom she assigns the task of conceiving a stratagem that would allow their best preservation and fruition. Xedro then finds a solution-to-wear by combining the fragility of the recycled polystyrene boards, with the solidity of recycled papier-mâché – a material favorite by both himself and Panaro in equal measure. The delicate artist's frames are there to remind us of a joint project that playfully mocks Enrico Crispolti's denomination of Panaro's graphic production as "drawn sculptures". Have her drawings become actual sculptures... or have they always been such?

It can be said that, all the pieces exhibited in *The dreams of the Uroboros* demonstrate the inexorable analytical and exploratory interest of Panaro, who since the sixties and without interruptions, experiments the specificity of a plastic rigor and an unmistakable stylistic code by engaging with a technical research that allows measure and confrontation with a variety of materials, choosing each time those that are better suited to her sculptural needs.

Also part of the exhibition is *The warrior*, 1963 (9 x 19.6 x 4.7 in), a small concrete statue loaned from the Rosa Panaro Archive, only survivor of its kind, originally belonging to a group of post-concretist works carved in stone and concrete.

In 1960, the striking discovery of papier-mâché – a material that Panaro works as if it were terracotta, and by so doing, transforms into a malleable

paste after long periods of study and a meticulous observation of the formulas' plastic potential. Papier-mâché will eventually replace the polymateric concretes, and combined with the use of clay, allow the artist to reach large volumes in total autonomy, without having to rely on a trainer. Another relevant piece present in the exhibition is a medium format papier-mâché sculpture entitled *The snake skin*, 1984 - a magnificent manufact created with the scalloping technique, last exhibited forty years ago in a solo show curated by Ela Caroli at «A for Art». This work is thematically anticipatory of the cycles of *Uroboros* and *Lilith's Metamorphoses* (1973 - 1982), which the seven sculptures in clay and polychrome ceramics protagonists of the second room belong to - and of particular value, since it's the twin of a very similar (no longer existing) copy made of concrete, plausibly produced in the early '70s.
